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Training Course: Conflict Sensitive Development Practice

Duration: 3 Days

Schedule: 28th – 30th 2020

Training Venue: Gulu, Uganda

Course Objective

By the end of the course, participants will have gained a deeper understanding of the concept conflict sensitivity and how to do conflict analysis. Participants will also be able to mainstream conflict it into their humanitarian and development projects, and implement, monitor and evaluate the impacts of their projects in conflict sensitive ways.

Course Relevance

As Northern Uganda emerged from the two decades of wars, development partners have shifted their focus to from emergency to recovery and development of the region. Northern Uganda and West Nile have also been overwhelmed with the challenges of hosting millions of refugees from South Sudan and DRC straining on government and host community resources as well as social services. Karamoja region on the other hand is faced with the challenges of emerging from post-disarmament and underdevelopment. Development and humanitarian partners have invested millions of dollars to address these challenges with mix results. Integrating conflict sensitivity into development and humanitarian programmes will help development and humanitarian partners avoid negative impacts, and maximize positive impacts of their programmes.

Course Content

- Introduction to conflict sensitivity
- How to do conflict analysis
- Applying conflict sensitivity at different stages of project cycles
- Applying conflict sensitivity into sectoral approaches (health, education, agriculture e.t.c)
- Institutional capacity building for conflict sensitivity
- Challenges and opportunities in conflict sensitivity mainstreaming

Target Group

This course is intended for development workers, NGO staff, local government staff, academicians, and students from tertiary institutions working in or intending to work in post-conflict contexts. This course is especially intended for people who are engaged or are planning to implement recovery and development programmes.

Training Cost

The course fee is UGX 450,000. There is limited concession for participants from local NGOs and CBOs and self-sponsoring. This cost is inclusive of refreshment, lunch, handouts, certificates, and stationery. Participants shall meet costs of their accommodation. Details of payment shall be provided to participants in their admission letters.

Number of Participants: The course will take a maximum of 25 participants.

Certificate: At the end of the training, certificates shall be awarded to participants.
